 Undergraduate Pharmacy has been added to the list of students eligible for Hepatitis B vaccine.

Pages 24 & 25, Human Papillomavirus Vaccine (GARDASIL™):

- The 0 − 6 − 12 month alternate schedule has been added.
- Footnote describes the use of this schedule for school year 2009/10, and the rationale for the extended schedule.

Page 44, Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (Prevnar™):

 This vaccine is now supplied as a latex-free product. Latex has been removed from the list of Contraindications to the vaccine.
