Clinical Immunization Roles, Scope, and Recommended/Required Education March 2021

#### **Interpretation Guide/ Definitions:**

Role - immunization activities are grouped into four main clinical roles as follows:

#### 1. Patient Assessment

- Determine suitability for those with complex medical conditions.
- Obtain consent as per the BC Immunization Manual, Appendix A: Informed Consent.

#### 2. Vaccine Preparation

Reconstitute and draw doses from vial.

#### 3. Immunizer

- Vaccinate patient and complete documentation.
- Direct patient to post-vaccine waiting area.

#### 4. Monitor Patient Post-Vaccine Waiting Area

- Monitor for adverse event (e.g., anaphylaxis).
- Assess situation and treat adverse event.
- Under Supervision indicates the roles/activities that must be performed by the regulated health professional under the regulatory supervision of another regulated health professional (i.e., each health profession's regulation specifies which regulated health professionals can delegate to and/or authorize under supervision the professional) to perform the specific restricted activities laid out in their regulation. The regulated health professional's regulatory college can detail supervision requirements for a profession in the performance of those activities.
  - Medical and pharmacy students are enabled through their regulatory colleges' Standards, Limits and Conditions of practice documents to provide immunization services.
  - o Requirements for other students are set out in the provincial health officer (PHO) order.
- PHO Order an order made by the Provincial Health Officer during a provincial state of emergency, which specifies the requirements (e.g., competency, training, supervision) that must be satisfied for a health profession (or a student of that profession) or other occupation to perform an activity (see <a href="PHO COVID-19 Orders">PHO COVID-19 Orders</a>).
  - A regulated health professional who is authorized in their professional regulation to immunize must supervise unregulated health providers and non-health professionals.
- Recommended Education indicates the recommended immunization-specific and on-site training that a regulated health care professional should take prior to performing activities of the clinical immunization roles.
- Required Education indicates the immunization-specific and on-site training that is required as per the PHO Order for any group of individuals (health care professionals and/or other occupations) who will be participating in one of the four clinical roles.

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#### **Additional Information:**

#### New as of March 25, 2021:

- The 15-hour BCCDC Immunizer Competency course has been replaced with a 3-hour BCCDC COVID-19
   Immunization Competency Course for Non-Nursing Professionals and Occupations. While the complete BCCDC Immunization Competency Course is required for all new immunization providers, it is recognized that in the context of the global pandemic, the need for an expedited condensed immunization competency education process is essential to administer the COVID-19 vaccine for those who will be providing COVID-19 vaccines only.
- The BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Competency Course for Nurses (RNs, RPNs, LPNs) has been updated to
  include anaphylaxis training and is now 3 hours.
- Midwives, Retired Midwives, and Midwifery students are now required to complete the condensed C1 training.
- Compensation for both training and immunizing will be provided and align with applicable rates as outlined in collective agreements and employment relationships for excluded professionals. Individuals will be compensated for their time to complete the training after they are hired/contracted.
- For professionals and individuals who are not registered with a regulatory college (retired), it is recommended
  that a criminal record check, verification of previous health professional training, previous registration (good
  standing) status with a regulatory college and assessment of competencies per the <a href="BCCDC COVID-19">BCCDC COVID-19</a>
   Immunization Skills Checklist are completed by the employer
- For those health professions and occupations with <u>PHO ORDERS</u> in place, please review the relevant order(s) in addition to the guidance in this document. The PHO Order will take precedent over any other guidance (in the case of a discrepancy).
- The **minimum** education requirements are listed below. It is expected that all health professionals and occupations practice according to their individual competence and seek out additional education as needed.
- It is required that all those involved in immunization activities listed below have their applicable competencies reviewed as per the <a href="BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Skills Checklist">BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Skills Checklist</a>. For those enabled via a PHO Order, this responsibility rests with a medical health officer or employer and must be performed by someone who can provide immunizations as a part of their regular scope of practice.
- For those immunization providers who have already taken C1 and have had their skills reviewed, confirmation of competencies using the BCCDC COVID-19 Immunization Skills Checklist is not required.
- The Community Paramedicine program is staffed by Primary Care Paramedics and Advanced Care Paramedic, both of which are enabled temporarily, through a PHO Order, to perform COVID-19 immunization roles/activities under supervision.
- Refer to the <u>BC Immunization Manual</u> for best practice guidelines to direct the provision of immunization services, with a particular focus on <u>Part 3 Management of Anaphylaxis in a Non-Hospital Setting and</u> the COVID-19 vaccine specific resources contained in <u>Part 4</u>: <u>Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine</u>, <u>Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine</u>, <u>COVID-19 Vaccine ChAdOx1-S [recombinant]</u> (<u>AstraZeneca/Verity Pharmaceuticals</u>, <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Screening Checklist</u>, <u>COVID-19 Vaccines HealthLink BC File #124</u>, and <u>COVID-19 Vaccine After Care Sheet</u>.





• Any individual handling dry ice as part of their immunization role must take the <u>Dry Ice Handling Safety Training</u> Course (listed as F in the **Immunization Training Modules** table below).

#### The following occupations have been identified as priorities for clinical roles within the mass vaccination strategy:

Regulated health professionals who have the authorization to perform the roles/activities independently AND can immunize without a PHO Order:
