

BC COVID-19 SPEAK Survey Dashboard **TECHNICAL NOTES**





MISSION

To understand the public's perceptions of risk, acceptability of public health measures and recovery measures, the broader impacts of COVID-19 on social, economic, physical health, mental wellbeing, and community resiliency.

VISION

To balance the successful management of the COVID-19 pandemic in British Columbia (BC) with the least burden on the overall health and wellbeing of the population.

VALUES

To build trust and support shared responsibility with the people we serve through improving our services and minimizing the unintended consequences of disease containment.

BACKGROUND

The BC COVID-19 Survey on Population Experience, Action and Knowledge (SPEAK) is a web-based population health survey to elicit BC residents' experience, knowledge, and actions during the COVID-19 pandemic, understand the impacts of the pandemic and plan approaches for future public health and recovery measures.

There have been two rounds of the BC COVID-19 SPEAK Survey; round 1 of the survey was conducted early in the pandemic from May 12 to May 31, 2020, and round 2 was conducted from April 8 to May 9, 2021, a year since the public health restrictions began on March 14, 2020.

Early in the pandemic, the immediate priorities were reducing the transmission of the virus, and while these measures have been disruptive to our everyday lives, the continuing global spread of COVID-19 has seen these measures extended, and the extent of the impact is unknown. Understanding the unintended impacts of the pandemic on the social, economic, physical health, mental wellness and resilience of communities is essential for BC's response and recovery. This information is vital in planning future public health measures and policies and a critical source for provincial and local government, healthcare decision-makers, academia, and community stakeholders to collaboratively address the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

To appropriately develop public health measures and policies that consider the unintended impacts, an accurate understanding of British Columbians' experience, knowledge and actions during the COVID-19 pandemic is crucial. While provincial COVID -19 case and fatality counts provide a direct gauge for the success of COVID -19 pandemic measures, there was a need for comprehensive, relevant, and representative local-level information on the impacts of public health measures on other aspects of BC residents' lives.



















The BC COVID-19 SPEAK Survey was developed collaboratively to fill this information gap, in collaboration between the BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC), First Nations Health Authority, Vancouver Coastal Health, Fraser Health, Interior Health, Northern Health, Island Health, and the Office of the Provincial Health Officer.

The survey sought to capture information within the following domains:

- Socio-demographics
- COVID-19 Testing, Response and Prevention
- Experience
- Risk and Protective Factors
- Healthcare Impacts
- Social Impacts
- Economic Impacts
- Resiliency

Domains added for round 2

- Vaccine
- Adaption

QUESTIONNAIRE OVERVIEW

Content and Format

The BC COVID-19 SPEAK Survey was developed with extensive consultation with stakeholders and partners. In the initial BC COVID-19 SPEAK Survey, there were 85 questions; 52 key survey questions were retained and integrated into the round 2 survey, which comprised 102 questions. Survey questions were drawn from mostly validated sources (e.g., Canadian Community Health Survey (CCHS), national and international COVID-19 Population Health Surveys including specific tools from Statistics Canada and the World Health Organization (WHO), and the national Census) where possible.

Except for age, sex (or gender in round 1), and municipality, which were required questions to complete the survey, all other questions were optional and included "prefer not to answer" as a response option.

The initial BC COVID-19 SPEAK survey was primarily a web-based population health survey available in English and Simplified Chinese. Language guides were available in French, Punjabi, American Sign Language (ASL), Korean, Spanish, Vietnamese, Farsi, Arabic and Traditional Chinese and a call centre was available for individuals who required assistance with completing the survey or support in another language. Round 2 was a web-based survey available in English, French, Punjabi and Simplified Chinese, and language guides were available in ASL, Korean, Spanish, Vietnamese, Farsi, Arabic and Traditional Chinese. A call centre was not used for round 2 of the survey.







Target Population

The target population for the survey was residents of BC who were 18 years of age or older. To achieve a large and representative sample, a response crude target of 2% of the urban population and 4% for rural/remote communities were set as determined by the Community Health Service Area (CHSA) density designation. Population sample targets were created at a 4% margin of error and were used as the primary target if this estimate was larger than the population proportion. Targets were also established for age, sex, income, education, and ethnicity by each geographic area. Progress towards these targets was monitored daily, and purposeful promotion and stakeholder outreach was done to better reach specific geographies and population demographics.

Through partnerships and collaboration, in round 1, a final sample of 394,382 responses was achieved and used in the final analytical dataset, reaching 456% of the crude provincial target (by population proportion). Population targets were surpassed for each Health Authority with Interior Health completing 56,501 surveys (337% of the crude target), Fraser Health completing 114,105 surveys (405% of the crude target), Vancouver Coastal Health completing 111,167 surveys (563% of the crude target), Island Health completing 97,164 surveys (633% of crude target) and Northern Health completing 15,445 (242% of crude target).

For round 2, a final sample of 206,241 responses was achieved, and 188,561 was used in the final analytical dataset, reaching 180% of the crude provincial target (by population proportion). Population targets were surpassed for each Health Authority with Interior Health completing 27,930 surveys (167% of the crude target), Fraser Health completing 51,720 surveys (183% of the crude target), Vancouver Coastal Health completing 52,957 surveys (268% of the crude target), Island Health completing 49,556 surveys (323% of crude target) and Northern Health completing 6,398 (100% of crude target).

In both rounds of the survey, not all sub-regions or demographic groups by geography did reach their target. Specifically, rural communities, populations with lower education, lower incomes, and some visible minorities were less reached and were prioritized for outreach.

Participant Recruitment and Survey Completion

For round 1 of the surveys, potential respondents could self-access the survey on the BCCDC website or call a dedicated call center. The survey was promoted by the BC Provincial Health Officer and Health Minister during their COVID-19 press conferences throughout the survey period. Survey promotion was conducted through mainstream media, Health Authorities, local government, non-government organizations, social media promotions (through Twitter and Facebook) and regional sites also conducted community outreach and promotion. Radio advertisements also ran in remote and rural areas of BC. Round 2 of the surveys was promoted the same as round 1, except more targeted recruitment was conducted through Facebook, Instagram stories, promotional print and digital media in regional newspapers, and promotional advertising at COVID-19 vaccination centers or testing sites. Potential respondents who had voluntarily provided an email address in round 1 of the surveys received an automatic email notification inviting them to participate in the survey. Other respondents could self-access the BCCDC website.







DATA MANAGEMENT

Data Clean Up and Processing

Demographics data were cleaned to create the final analytical dataset, which only included surveys where a Health Service Delivery Area (HSDA) geography, age, and sex (or gender in round 1) were assigned as well, as the respondent must have progressed to at least 31% of the round 1 survey and 33% in the round 2 survey. Duplicates by Provincial Health Number, email or phone number were removed if they were also matched by age and sex/gender. Those who withdrew consent after the survey was submitted were also removed.

Question format was reviewed (i.e., single select vs. multi-select responses), and appropriate denominators were selected for each indicator. Those who did not answer the corresponding question or selected "Prefer not to answer" or "Don't know" were excluded from the denominators of that indicator (See Appendix 1 and Appendix 2).

Data Weighting

Statistical weighting is often used in large surveys to ensure that the sample of collected responses reflects the overall target population. This type of weighting compensates because certain demographics are less likely to respond to a survey. For example, most general population surveys have substantially more female than male respondents (often 60% female), although, in the general population, the number of males and females is very similar. Because surveys tend to over-represent females and under-represent males in the population, a weight is used to compensate for this bias. The other common characteristics that affect response rate and need to be considered are age and education.

Establishing at the outset, detailed socio-demographic targets for each geographic area of interest within the survey allowed a more focused participant recruitment, with the ultimate benefit of applying smaller weights. The margin of error around an estimate increases when large weights are applied. Such purposeful sampling allows for more confident and stable estimates to be derived.

For both rounds of the BC COVID-19 SPEAK Survey, the samples were weighted using 2016 Canadian Census data by geography (HSDA, Local Health Area (LHA), and CHSA) for age, sex, education level, and ethnicity to account for residual differences in sample demographics and to ensure that the sample is as representative as possible of the overall geographic population that is being reported on (see Appendix 1 and Appendix 2).

Each geography (HSDA, LHA, CHSA) specific survey weight is derived from the corresponding geography, sex, and age, plus education and ethnicity if they are available. Ethnicity was categorized into five groups to limit stratifications included in weights while optimizing representativeness across the survey region. These groupings are Indigenous (First Nations, Métis, Inuit), Chinese, South Asian, White, and all other ethnicities combined.







ANALYSIS

Use of Data

The data may be used for the following purposes:

- To support ongoing surveillance, reporting, and analysis of the impact of the COVID-19 response in BC;
- To understand the experience of British Columbians during the pandemic;
- To inform ongoing COVID-19 public health measures in BC; and
- To inform public health interventions and to plan or to implement healthcare services in BC.

Selection of Indicators for the Dashboard

A complete list of indicators was drawn from the survey questions. Descriptive analysis was conducted to describe, organize, and summarize the survey data, and indicators were reviewed. Indicators were selected for inclusion on the BC COVID-19 SPEAK Dashboards based on the importance and relevance of the findings to survey objectives and in consultation with epidemiology leads from the regional Health Authorities (RHA), BCCDC, and the Ministry of Health (MoH).

Relevance and importance of questions in terms of actionability were considered along with the following guidelines:

- Informs testing strategy
- Public health management of cases and contacts
- Measures targeted at individuals
- Measures targeted at the community
- Broader policy considerations
- Supports stratification geographic/socioeconomic (equity)

Indicators added for round 2

- · Monitor change from early in the pandemic to one year on
- Guide COVID-19 vaccine program decisions and equity considerations
- Guide health, social, and economic recovery

Stratifications

The BC COVID-19 SPEAK Dashboards allows the user to explore indicators by five different levels of geography: provincial, by Health Authority, HSDA (Region), LHA (Sub-region), and CHSA (Community). Each indicator is made available at the BC, Health Authority, and HSDA by age, sex, education, income, ethnicity, and household composition.

Weights

All analyses were performed based on weights calculated at the same corresponding geography level, except indicators at the Health Authority and BC geography level where the HSDA weights were used.

Statistical Significance

Statistical significance was not reported for the indicators in the BC COVID-19 SPEAK Dashboards when comparisons are allowed. Differences observed upon an exploration of the dashboard may or may not be statistically significant and should be interpreted with caution.

Data Suppression

Efforts were made to report only reliable estimates and to not release estimates that are highly variable given the small sample size. Coefficients of variation were calculated for each stratification level for each indicator in the dashboard. Estimates with coefficients of variation greater than 33.3% were considered unreliable and were suppressed in the profiles. Statistics Canada uses similar cut-offs in national surveys like the Canadian Community Health Survey. Data were also suppressed for geography with more than 25% indigenous population or unanimous responses to a question with a sample size < 30. Suppression is indicated with a missing or gray bar in the dashboard.
