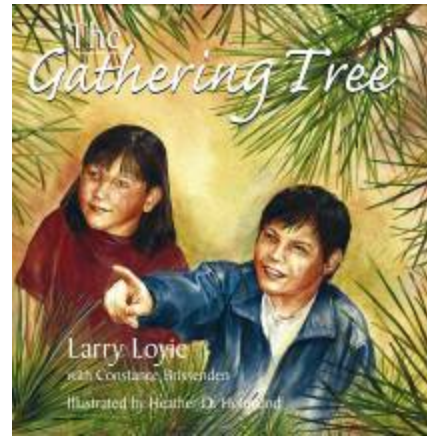

1. A Guide to Wise Practices for HIV/AIDS Education and Prevention Program

A guide based on practice and research to assist communities in planning HIV/AIDS education programs. This resource features summaries of successful projects conducted both locally and around the world.



2. The Gathering Tree: A Children's Book with a First Nations Storyline

A beautifully illustrated children's book about HIV/AIDS. Written by award-winning First Nations author, Larry Loyie and co-author Constance Brissenden, this is a gentle, positive story of a First Nations family facing HIV. The story reveals how knowledge brings understanding and self awareness and addresses aspects of physical, mental, emotional health.

3. Reclaiming Tradition, Around the Kitchen Table (ATKT): a Model for HIV, Hepatitis and Sexual Health Education

The goal of the ATKT model is to train women in Aboriginal communities to implement a series of ATKT sessions with women in their own communities. These sessions combine information about HIV, hepatitis and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) with cultural activities such as cedar bark weaving or beadwork.



4. Leading The Way: First Nations Leaders of BC's Northwest Speak About HIV/AIDS

The purpose of "Leading the Way" is to raise awareness of HIV/AIDS and to inspire others to step forward and speak about HIV. As we open up discussion in our communities, we help prevent the spread of HIV and create more supportive communities for those living with HIV. We invite you to read the words of these leaders and share your thoughts with others in your own family and community.

5. Healing House: Hepatitis C Teaching Toolkit

This series of pamphlets includes information on Hepatitis C. These pamphlets are geared towards Aboriginal people and come packaged in a folder with Coast Salish art through out.
