**How do we work together?**

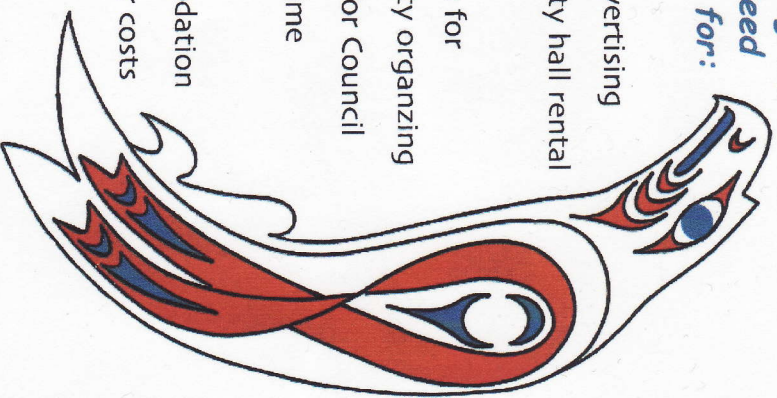
We are able to come to your community or organization free of charge.
