Acyclovir and Valacyclovir

Acyclovir (Zovirax®) and valacyclovir (Valtrex®) are antiviral medications taken by mouth to reduce the duration and discomfort of an outbreak of oral herpes ("cold sores") or genital herpes.

Allergies

• Tell your healthcare provider if you have an allergy to any antiviral medication such as: acyclovir (Zovirax®), famciclovir (Famvir®) or valacyclovir (Valtrex®).

Pregnancy and Chest/Breastfeeding

Acvclovir and valacyclovir may be used with caution during pregnancy and during chest/breastfeeding. Please consult your healthcare provider.

CAUTION

- **Drug Interactions:** Tell your healthcare provider if you are taking any prescription, non-prescription, herbal, or recreational products. Not all individual drug interactions are listed in this document.
- Do not take the following while taking acyclovir or valacyclovir:
 - Varicella vaccine (Varilrix®, Varivax®)
 - Herpes zoster vaccine (Zostavax®)
 - Measles, mumps, rubella, varicella vaccine (Priorix®-Tetra, ProQuad®)

Side Effects

 You may experience diarrhea, nausea, abdominal pain, vomiting, headache, lightheadedness or dizziness.

Instructions for Taking

- Acyclovir and valacyclovir may be taken with or without food.
- Taking with food may reduce the chance of stomach upset.
- Take with a full glass of water.

 If you miss a dose, take it as soon as you remember. However, if it is close to your next dose, skip the dose and resume your usual dosing time. Do not take a double dose.





Acyclovir and Valacyclovir (cont'd)

Storage Instructions

- Store at room temperature between 15 and 30°C.
- Protect from light, heat, and moisture.
- Do not use medications beyond the printed expiry date.
- · Keep away from the reach of children.
