Chapter 1: Communicable Disease Control

<u>Rabies</u>

- The Interim Guidelines for the Use of RIG in BC have been discontinued and dose-sparing measures are no longer required. As such, the Rabies guidelines have been updated to remove reference to the Interim Guidelines in subsection *4.2 Rabies Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (RPEP).*
 - Please note that the <u>Interim Direction for the use of rabies vaccine for post exposure</u> prophylaxis in BC is being evaluated by the Rabies Working Group and CD Policy Committee and will be available in early 2020.

Immune Globulins

Human Rabies Immune Globulin (Rablg): HyperRAB® & Imogam® Rabies Pasteurized

The Interim Guidelines for the Use of RIG in BC have been discontinued as demand has
returned to baseline and dose-sparing measures are no longer required. As such, the
product pages have been updated to revert back to the administration of a full dose of
RabIg. Following infiltration of RabIg into and around the wound(s), any remaining
volume should be injected intramuscularly.
