- If you are interested in constructing a provincially licensed dairy plant, please contact Food Protection Services to discuss the application steps with a dairy inspector. A detailed proposal including the building plans must be approved by a dairy inspector prior to the start of any construction.
- Use Adobe Reader to complete the form. Adobe Reader is available for free at <u>Adobe Acrobat</u> <u>Reader (Canada)</u>.
- Submit a New Plant License application after you have engaged with the Food Protection Services dairy inspectors.
- Submit as many copies of the New Plant Dairy Worker License Application with your New Plant License as needed to include all of your workers.
