A NONREACTIVE RESULT means that antibodies to HIV have not been detected. Test MAY detect antibodies as early as 3 to 4 weeks after infection but may miss an estimated 20% of acute or very early infections. Greater than 95% of infected people will be positive by 4-6 weeks and nearly all by 3 months.		
Reactive Result		2 blue spots	A <u>REACTIVE RESULT</u> indicates antibodies to HIV-1 or HIV-2 have been detected. This reactive result should be regarded as preliminary only and must be confirmed by standard laboratory HIV testing on a venous sample to rule out a false positive result. Report preliminary positive result to local Medical Health Officer or designated HIV/CD intake nurse in your region.

4. Mix solution 2 and add to membrane	5. Mix solution 3 and add to membrane	6. Read and record ALL results within 5 minutes.
