#### **REVISIONS OVERVIEW**

Revisions align with the 2015 BCCDC TB Manual.

### 1) Format

Increased use of tables, flow charts and integrated "practitioner alert" text boxes for emphasis on implications for practice

  - Definition of TB screening
- 3) **Definitions:** Definitions align with those in the 2015 BCCDC TB Manual

- 4) **TB Assessment:** Content reorganized to align with the BCCDC TB Skin Testing (TST) course and Quick Reference Guide:
  - TB Health History: TB History, Risk Factors and Symptoms
    - Risk Assessment: Persons who inject drugs (PWID) and attendants of residential school are included within the Risk Factor table.
  - Physical Assessment
  - Screening tests: Regarding TST and IGRA
    - Incorporation of TST cut-points table, providing more information on when a TST is positive.
    - o New screening table for those presenting with prior IGRA test results.
  - Diagnostic tests: Regarding sputum collection and diagnostic imaging
- 5) **HIV testing:** Offer or recommend HIV testing for people presenting for TB screening. This aligns with the Provincial Medical Health Officer's <u>HIV Testing Guidelines for the Province of British Columbia</u> and the BCCDC CD Manual: Chapter 5 Sexually Transmitted Infections Section 2: <u>Guidelines for Testing Follow up, and Prevention of HIV</u>
- 6) TB Screening Guidelines: This section is divided into different screening programs:
  - Routine
  - Contact
  - HIV infected people: aligns with the BC CfE HIV/AIDS Primary Care Guidelines
  - Immigration
  - Symptomatic

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- Travellers
- Indigenous people, living on-reserve: annual and enhanced screening guidelines for indigenous people living on-reserve have been added for use by Community Health Nurses employed by FNHA working
