¶ Children who had chickenpox or shingles disease, confirmed by a blood test, at 1 year of age or older do not need the chickenpox vaccine and should get the MMR vaccine at 4 years of age.

* A second dose is needed 4 weeks after the first dose if receiving the vaccine for the first time.

♦ Hepatitis A vaccine is offered to Aboriginal children living both on-reserve and off-reserve.
