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| <b>Meningococcal C Conjugate</b><br>HealthLinkBC File # <a href="#">23a</a>            | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adults born before 2002 who are 24 years of age and under who did not receive a dose of the vaccine on or after their 10<sup>th</sup> birthday.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adults with occupational risks (the cost of the vaccine may be covered by your employer).</li> </ul>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adults who want protection.</li> </ul> |
