

Yukon's Pandemic




Disproportionate Effects

Approximately 22% of Yukon's population i • 56% of medevacs


Differing Vaccination Rates

Project Goals

- 1. CONTRIBUTE Yukon-specific data to national data collection efforts aimed at understanding vaccine access, uptake, and hesitancy.
- 2. IMPROVE understanding of attitudes and opinions related to vaccines, including COVID-19 and routine vaccines.
- 3. EXPLORE perspectives and experiences of First Nation communities with vaccines.
- 4. BUILD understanding of factors that contribute to vaccine uptake and/or vaccine hesitancy.
- 5. IDENTIFY community-based innovations for improving equitable access to vaccines and supporting informed decision-making.
- 6. HIRE and TRAIN community researchers, supporting local employment, skill development, and research capacity.
- 7. PREPARE for future health emergencies.


