

Background

Immunization coverage assessment is an important part of a quality immunization program. Immunization coverage assessment serves three main functions:

- i) Identifying populations with low levels of immunization coverage
- ii) Evaluating the delivery of immunization programs
- iii) Informing program planning

The 2007 Immunize BC Strategic Framework for Immunization target for influenza vaccination for residents of residential care facilities is 90% coverage. Influenza vaccination coverage for residents of residential care facilities in BC has ranged from 89% to 93% from the 2003/04 to 2011/12 influenza seasons.

Objective

i) To quantify the proportion of residents of residential care facilities in British Columbia who were vaccinated against influenza during the 2012/13 influenza season.

Methods

Residential care facilities were defined as facilities with 50% or more residents aged 65 years and older that are either:

- licensed under the Hospital Act; or
- licensed under the Community Care and Assisted Living Act and provide some health care services.

A list of the residential care facilities included in the 2011/12 influenza season's vaccination coverage statistics was sent to each health authority. Residential care facilities that closed during the previous year were removed and new facilities were added to the list. For each residential care facility, data were collected on the number of residents who were vaccinated against influenza and the total number of residents.

Vaccination coverage data were collected by health authority staff and either entered into an online data collection form or entered into a Microsoft Excel file and emailed to the BC Centre for Disease Control.



Results

Reporting of facilities (table 1)

348/357 (97%) residential care facilities in British Columbia are included in this report




Figure 1: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities, British Columbia from 2003/04 to 2012/13

2012/13 influenza vaccination coverage (tables 2 and 3; figures 1 to 5)

- 89% (26,784/30,109) of residents of residential care facilities in BC were vaccinated against influenza, which was the same as the coverage in 2011/12
- 84% to 92% was the range across the six health authorities
- 72% to 94% was the range across the sixteen health service delivery areas
- 21% to 100% was the range across all residential care facilities in BC
- 193/348 (55%) facilities met the 90% immunization coverage target, which is similar to the 180/332 (54%) facilities in 2011/12

Results excluding privately funded facilities (Appendix tables 5A and 6A)

- 97% (290/299) publicly funded or contracted residential facilities were included
- 90% (23,610/26,264) of residents were vaccinated against influenza

Summary

Influenza immunization data were available for the majority of residential care facilities in all health authorities. The overall influenza vaccination coverage for residents of residential care facilities in BC was 89%, slightly below the Immunization BC target of at least 90% coverage; 193/348 (55%) facilities met the 90% coverage target. Influenza immunization coverage was similar when privately funded facilities were excluded from the analysis.

Within each health authority, there was a wide range of influenza vaccination coverage for residential care facilities. The reasons behind the variation in vaccination coverage between facilities are not known.

While the 89% influenza vaccination coverage for residents of residential care facilities achieved for the 2012/13 season is very close to the target of 90%, substantial room for improvement remains for some facilities.




Figure 2: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by health authority, 2012/13




Figure 3: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by health service delivery area, 2012/13






Figure 4: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by facility size, British Columbia 2012/13




Figure 5: Variation in influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by health authority and for British Columbia, 2012/13



Figure 5 illustrates the range of influenza immunization coverage for residential care facilities in each health authority and for BC for the 2012/13 influenza season. The horizontal line below each box represents the lowest observed coverage value (within the expected range); the lower edge of each box represents the 25th percentile; the solid horizontal line within each box represent the median coverage value; the upper edge of each box represents the 75th percentile; the horizontal line above each box represents the highest observed coverage value (within the expected range); and the dots represent facilities with unusually high or low coverage values which may be outliers.
