Influenza vaccination coverage for residents of residential care facilities British Columbia, 2016/17

Background

Immunization coverage assessment is an important part of a quality immunization program and serves three main functions:

- i) Identifying populations with low levels of immunization coverage
- ii) Evaluating the delivery of immunization programs
- iii) Informing program planning

The 2007 Immunize BC Strategic Framework for Immunization target for influenza vaccination for residents of residential care facilities is 90% coverage. Annual influenza vaccination coverage for residents of residential care facilities in British Columbia (BC) ranged from 87% to 91% from the 2008/09 to 2015/16 influenza seasons.

Objective

To quantify the percentage of residents of residential care facilities in British Columbia who were vaccinated against influenza during the 2016/17 influenza season.

Methods

Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities was calculated at the facility level, health service delivery area level, health authority level, and for BC. There are five regional health authorities in BC, which are comprised of 16 health service delivery areas.

Residential care facilities were defined as facilities with 50% or more residents aged 65 years and older that are either:

- licensed under the Hospital Act; or
- licensed under the Community Care and Assisted Living Act and provide some health care services.

In BC, licensing of residential care facilities is conducted by regional Health Authority Community Care Facility Licensing programs. A list of the residential care facilities included in the 2015/16 influenza season's vaccination coverage statistics was sent to each health authority for review and updating. Residential care facilities that closed during the previous year were removed and new facilities were added to the list. For each residential care facility, data were collected on the number of residents who were vaccinated against influenza and the total number of residents. Vaccination coverage data were obtained from facilities entered into an online data collection form by health authority staff.

The results were also calculated excluding privately funded facilities. The remaining subset of facilities are health authority owned and operated, and contracted.

Results

Reporting of facilities (table 1 and 5)

 349/365 (96%) residential care facilities in BC are included in this report, including 251/263 (95%) publicly funded or contracted residential care facilities, and 98/102 (96%) privately funded residential care facilities

2016/17 influenza vaccination coverage (tables 2 and 3; figures 1 to 5)

- 87% (26,977/30,951) of residents of residential care facilities in BC were vaccinated against influenza, unchanged from 2015/16
- 82% to 92% coverage was the range across the five health authorities
- 74% to 95% coverage was the range across the sixteen health service delivery areas
- 35% to 100% coverage was the range across all residential care facilities in BC
- 177/349 (51%) facilities met the 90% immunization coverage target, as in 2015/16

Results excluding privately funded facilities (Table 6)

• 87% (19,156/21,960) of residents were vaccinated against influenza, the same percent as for all facility types

Summary

Influenza immunization data were available for the majority of residential care facilities. Influenza vaccination coverage for residents of residential care facilities in BC was 87%, three percent below the Immunization BC coverage target; only 177/349 (51%) facilities met the 90% coverage target. Influenza immunization coverage was the same (87%) in publicly funded or contracted facilities as in privately funded facilities. Influenza vaccine coverage of residential care residents has declined by two percent for the past two seasons compared to 2014/5, driven by small declines in IHA and NHA despite no change in FHA and VCH, and a small increase in VIHA, with evidence of gradual declines in all regions in the past decade, except VCH.

There was a wide range of influenza vaccination coverage for at the facility level. The reasons for this variation were not assessed.

Figure 1: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities, 2007/08 to 2016/17




Figure 2: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by health authority, 2016/17




Figure 3: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by health service delivery area, 2016/17





Figure 4: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by facility size (number of residents), 2016/17






Figure 5: Influenza immunization coverage for residents of residential care facilities by facility within each health authority, 2016/17

Figure 5 illustrates the range of influenza immunization coverage for residential care facilities in each health authority and for BC for the 2016/17 influenza season. The horizontal line below each box represents the lowest observed coverage value that is greater than or equal to the first quartile minus 1.5 times the interquartile range; the lower edge of each box represents the 25th percentile; the solid horizontal line within each box represent the median coverage value; the upper edge of each box represents the 75th percentile; the horizontal line above each box represents the highest observed coverage value that is less than or equal to the third quartile plus 1.5 times the interquartile range; and the dots represent facilities with unusually high or low coverage values which are outliers.
