



Potential harms


Of 35 people that have smoked/inhaled in the past 6 months and used a bowl/straight pipe:

- 17% used a second-hand pipe
- 20% injected instead when they couldn't get new bowl/straight pipes

Participants reported difficulty picking up harm reduction supplies due to:

- site not being open when needed (6%)
- site was too far (8%)

Method of use in the past 3 days, by substance



Overdose

experienced an OPIOID 40% **OVERDOSE** in the past six months

> experienced a **STIMULANT 26**% **OVERDOSE** in the past six months

witnessed an **OPIOID OVERDOSE** in the **59%** past six months

Keeping safe and harm reduction



83% of participants owned a Take Home Naloxone kit, while 60% owned a cell phone and 77% had access to the internet.



In the past 6 months, 57% had used drugs at an overdose prevention site or supervised consumption site.

Participation was limited to people who access harm reduction sites, and results are therefore not representative of all people who use substances in BC. As of 2022, this project is made possible with funding from the Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions
