Surveillance plan for Ebola contacts and cases in BC

The BC Ebola Public Health WG recommended on November 10 2014 that BC public health professionals collate and share information gathered on all Ebola cases and all contacts provincially to monitor such occurrences, share with public health professionals within BC and learn from our activities.

Data collection

Retrospective: August 1-November 16, 2014

Health Authorities will attempt to complete a subset of variables (Table 1) for cases and contacts reported in BC from August 1, 2014 to November 16, 2014 based on retrospectively collected information. Data will be entered into the case and contact report forms or collated in text summary. Data will be shared with the BCCDC for provincial analysis.

Prospective: November 17, 2014-ongoing

- Any cases and contacts reported as of November 17, 2014 will be interviewed using the national case report form² or provincial contact report form³.
- Panorama was selected as the provincial electronic tool and is expected to be available in early December.
- Once Panorama is available, HAs will enter data directly into it. HAs not using Panorama will send completed forms to BCCDC.
- Information on travelers returning from other countries without widespread and intense transmission (E.g., Mali) referred to public health by Quarantine screening should be reported to BCCDC daily or as they occur to allow for aggregate reporting for number of cases and by country.

Reporting

Analysis and dissemination

BCCDC will complete a linelist for internal use (HAs and PHO) and an aggregate summary for sharing externally. Further qualitative information can be shared during the PH WG mtgs.
