Tainted Crack and Powder Cocaine Warning!

Most of the crack/cocaine that is currently available in Toronto contains Levamisole.

Levamisole is a toxic substance that is used for de-worming animals. There is no way of telling by looking/tasting the crack/cocaine whether or not it contains Levamisole.

If you have any of the following symptoms, go to the hospital emergency room *immediately*:

Skin Conditions (see other side)

Dark skin patches on your body. At first it looks like a bruise, then gets darker and forms scabs. The skin can die and start to come off.

Infections

Rapid onset of fever, chills, sore throat, pneumonia (fever, chills, shortness of breath, coughing).

The infection is treatable! Get help now.

Tell the hospital staff that you use cocaine/crack, and you are worried that your symptoms are from Levamisole. They need all the facts to help you, and they need to see you quickly.
