Re: Update to Communicable Disease Control Manual, Chapter 1 – Communicable Disease Control - Measles, Mumps and Rubella Control Guidelines

Measles, Mumps and Rubella Guidelines

The following clarifications shown in underlined text have been added to footnote 2 below the measles, mumps and rubella vaccine dosing table by year of birth in all three guidelines on page 22 of measles, 18 of mumps and 19 of rubella.

- The mumps footnote has been added to the health care workers chart.
- Mumps dose recommendation within the table for non-health care workers born 1970 and later has been revised to read 1 or 2 doses. The number of doses recommended for specific sub-populations within this group is further defined in revised footnote 2.
- One dose of mumps vaccine is recommended for any susceptible adult born in 1970 and later. The following should receive two doses: children as per routine schedule; students of post-secondary educational settings and travelers to outside of North America. <u>Health care workers should receive 1 dose if born</u> between January 1, 1957- December 31, 1969; 2 doses if born on or after 1970.
