"Gonorrhea is part of routine screening for STIs. It's found in body fluids — like (pre)cum, vaginal or anal fluids. The test is a urine sample or swab."



"Often there may be only mild or no symptoms. Or symptoms can show up 2-7 days after being infected."

Gonorrhea symptoms may include:

common sexually transmitted



infection (STI)?"

Painful urination



Unusual discharge or bleeding



Painful intercourse



Stomach pain



Swelling or pain in the genitals or anus

"If it's not treated, Gonorrhea can lead to infertility, pelvic disease, a higher chance of getting HIV, and other long-term problems. If you're pregnant, it can also pass onto the baby during delivery. Luckily, antibiotics get rid of it."



"For the treatment to work and not reinfect each other, you and your partners would need to get antibiotics at the same time."

Ways to practice safer sex:



Condom



Dental dam



Latex gloves



Clean sex toys

"It's important to try to avoid all sexual activity for another 7 days after everyone starts the treatment. After that, it's a good idea to test regularly and practice safer sex."
